

Yearly investment in green infrastructure

Co-financing is the driving force for the implementation of projects. This is why, every year, Verband Region Stuttgart sponsors a call for ideas. Municipalities may submit project proposals to this competition with an overall grant volume of 1.5 million Euros. Municipalities can apply for tal and climatic balance. Open spaces make up around 75 % of the region's subsidies of up to 50 % of the eligible costs but have to carry the rest of the project costs. Co-financing covers a wide variety of measures – from door recreation options are as close as a 10-minute walk. Stuttgart region is raising the standards of regional bike or hiking trails and establishing observation points or picnic areas at the waterfront to environmental improvements. The main goal is to create an integrated network of recreation offers as well as natural spaces of high environmental value. Up to now, co-financed projects are distributed equally across the region.

SUMMARY

Stuttgart's regional landscape park is a highly effective tool due to the close linking of planning and financing that is outstanding in Baden-Wuerttemberg. The park becomes visible and tangible via a large number of implemented projects that provide added value for humans and nature.


